Pastor Lofgren will be locked up on Tuesday, December 6th from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and could use your help for bail money. Pastor is trying to earn \$2400 toward Muscular Dystrophy and is sponsoring a little boy by the name of Blake Thomas Van Houten. Blake has Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Duchenne is one of nine types of muscular dystrophy, a group of genetic, degenerative diseases primarily affecting voluntary muscles. Duchenne weakens the muscles and can have the child in a wheelchair by the age of twelve. Blake is as active as he can be and he loves to play with his friends. THE TWELVE APOSTLES OF JESUS

A Bible study By Rev. Donald G. Fischer

The apostles of Jesus were the foundation stones of His Church. In Revelation 21:14 we are told that the twelve foundations of the wall of the New Jerusalem will have in them the names of the twelve apostles. It is evident, therefore, that our Lord attaches great importance to these men. In the book of Matthew we read in chapter 10:1-4 **Jesus called his twelve disciples and gave them authority to force evil spirits out of people and to cure every disease and sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first and foremost, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James and his brother John, the sons of Zebedee; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James (son of Alphaeus), and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who later betrayed Jesus.**

This month we will study James, the son of Alphaeus , Thaddaeus (Jude), Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot.

JAMES, THE SON OF ALPHEAUS

From the following Bible passages complete the below listed statements about what the Bible has to say about James, the son of Alphaeus. (**Acts 1:9-14, Mark 2:13-14**)

After Jesus ascended into heaven, James with the other disciples went back to _____. Here they joined the women and _____ the _____ of Jesus in _____. During the life of Jesus, He called Levi (Matthew) who was by occupation a _____. Levi was also the son of _____. This means that Levi and James could be _____.

HISTORY AND TRADITION: James, the son of Alphaeus, is the apostle about whom we know the least. The New Testament tells us nothing but his name. Even tradition and legend are almost silent about him. The only things that legend says about him are that he preached in Persia, and that he died a martyr by crucifixion.

THADDAEUS (JUDE)

Jude was certainly one of the original Twelve as his name is listed in the Gospels. However, it is not known when or on what occasion he became a disciple of Jesus. Nor can we be sure that the apostle Jude is the author of the New Testament epistle that bears his name. When we reviewed the four listing in the Scriptures of the Apostles, we noted that, in Luke's Gospel and Acts, Jude was listed as Jude or Judas. But in Matthew and Mark he was called Thaddeus. The common thinking was that Matthew and

Mark chose to list him in this manner so that he would not be confused with the traitor Judas Iscariot. Jude is only quoted in one passage of scripture which is **John 14:22 "then Judas (not Judas Iscariot) said, "But, Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?"**

HISTORY AND TRADITION: It is said that Jude went to preach the gospel in Edessa near the Euphrates River. There he healed many and many believed in the name of the Master. Jude went from there to preach the Gospel in other places. He was killed with arrows at Ararat. A western tradition maintains that Jude preached the gospel in Mesopotamia, then joined the Apostle Simon in Persia, where they evangelized together, made many converts, and finally were martyred. The chosen symbol for him is a ship because he was a missionary thought to be a fisherman.

SIMON (THE ZEALOT)

From the following Bible passages, what does the Bible tell us about Simon? (**Mat 10:4; Mar 3:18; Luke 6:15; Acts 1:13**) _____.

Simon, the Zealot, one of the little-known followers called the Canaanites or Zealots, lived in Galilee. The Zealots were fanatical Jewish Nationalists who had heroic disregard for the suffering involved and the struggle for what they regarded as the purity of their faith. The Zealots were crazed with hatred for the Romans. It was this hate for Rome that destroyed the city of Jerusalem. Josephus, a noted Jewish historian, says the Zealots were reckless persons zealous in good practices and extravagant and reckless in the worst actions.

From this background, we see that Simon was a fanatical Nationalist, a man devoted to the Law, a man with bitter hatred for anyone who dared to compromise with Rome. Yet, Simon clearly emerged as a man of faith. He abandoned all his hatred for the faith that he showed toward his Master and his love that he was willing to share with the rest of the disciples and especially Matthew, the Roman tax collector. Simon, the Zealot, the man who once would have killed in loyalty to Israel, became the man who saw that God will have no forced service.

HISTORY AND TRADITION: Tradition says that Simon died as a martyr. His apostolic symbol is a fish lying on a Bible, which indicates he was a former fisherman who became a fisher of men through preaching,

JUDAS ISCARIOT

HISTORY AND TRADITION: Tradition says that Judas was a violent Jewish Nationalist who had followed Jesus in hope that through Him his nationalistic flame and dreams might be realized. When Judas determined that Jesus was not going to be a nationalistic leader, he decided to turn against him.

CONCLUSION

With this we conclude our study on the Apostles of Jesus. There might be many conclusions that a person could draw from this study and even some unanswered questions but some of the more important answers a person could draw from this study are: Jesus chose men from all walks of life to spread the good news that "He came into this world to save all people from their sins." The only condition was that they "follow him and he would make them fishers of men." The Apostles were sinners, even as we are, and were subject to temptation and torment from Satan. Even though the Master himself was leading and teaching, an Apostle chose to follow Satan. The Apostles were not spared from ridicule and harm that often comes from being a follower of the Lord. The Apostles, led by the Holy Spirit, spread the gospel across the then known world and from there it has spread to us today.
