In 1860, ground was purchased by St. Peter Lutheran Church for a cemetery. This parcel of land located at the corner of Dimond & German Streets was called German Lutheran Cemetery.

In 1895, the cemetery was moved to its present location north of Huntington. In 1920 the name was changed to Pilgrims Rest Cemetery and is no longer restricted to church members. Individual and family lots are available throughout the cemetery.

## Chapel

Committal services are held in our open-air chapel, conveniently located away from the gravesite. This spacious chapel offers families a comfortable setting with ample parking and handicap accessibility. The chapel serves two key purposes: enhancing safety by reducing the risk of trips and falls and minimizing disruptions to ongoing cemetery operations.

Graveside committals are available for an additional charge. Following the service, the grave is promptly filled and later seeded as weather permits. Until the turf is fully established, burial areas may appear uneven. As the soil naturally settles, the grave may require repeated renovations before achieving its final, refined appearance.

## Burial Plots

Burial in a cemetery remains the most popular method of interment in the United States. Cremation is an increasingly appealing method of disposition. Pilgrims Rest Cemetery has burial plots and cremation plots available for purchase. Individual and family lots are available throughout the cemetery. Cremation plots are smaller and include a foundation for a grave marker. Each cremation plot is designed to allow for two burials

## Perpetual Care Fund

A portion of the revenue from the sale of each gravesite is placed into a perpetual care fund to cover the annual cost of grounds and gravesite maintenance.
