	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.
	<b>John 17:17</b> Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.

	<b>The Third Commandment:</b> Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.
	<b>Ephesians 2:1</b> And you were dead in the trespasses and sins

	<b>The Fourth Commandment:</b> Honor your father and your mother.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents or other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.
	<b>Psalms 124:8</b> Our help is in the name of the LORD, who made heaven and earth.

	<b>The Fifth Commandment:</b> You shall not murder.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.
	<b>2 Corinthians 5:21</b> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

	<b>The Sixth Commandment:</b> You shall not commit adultery.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.
	<b>John 8:34-36</b> Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin.... If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

	<b>The Seventh Commandment:</b> You shall not steal.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.
	<b>John 14:27</b> Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

	<b>The Eighth Commandment:</b> You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.
	<b>John 10:27-28</b> My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand.

	<b>What does this mean?</b> We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

	<b>(The Close of the Commandments):</b> What does God say about all these commandments? He says, "I the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments."

	<b>What does this mean?</b> God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear his wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.

	<b>What does this mean?</b> I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened my with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith....

	<b>What does this mean?</b> I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened my with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

	<b>What is Baptism?</b> Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.
	<b>Which is that word of God?</b> Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 28:19

	<b>What benefits does baptism give?</b> It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.
	<b>Which are these words and promises of God?</b> Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned."

	<b>How can water do such great things?</b> Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus chapter 3...

	<b>Titus 3:5-8:</b> "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying."

Due 2-26	
	<b>What does such baptizing with water indicate?</b> It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.
	<b>Where is this written?</b> St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: “We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.” Romans 6:4
Due 3-5	
	<b>What is Confession?</b> Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.
	<b>What sins should we confess?</b> Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord’s prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

	<b>What is the Office of the Keys?</b> The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

	<i>(Office of the Keys)</i> <b>Where is this written?</b> This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.” John 20:22-23

	<b>What do you believe according to these words?</b> I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular, when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.
