What preparations are you in the midst of? Trimming the tree? Baking cookies? Stringing Christmas lights? Dusting off festive decorations?

One of the main themes of Advent is 'the coming of Christ'. We remember His first coming in a manger; we celebrate His present coming in both Word and Sacrament (the Word made flesh dwelling among <u>us</u>); we anticipate his final coming in glory on the Day of Judgment.

While most of us are preoccupied this month with remembering Christ's <u>first</u> coming at Christmas (and preparing for it), Advent is the herald that calls us to prepare for His <u>next</u> comings:

- Repent. Turn your hearts away from sin and direct them to the Savior who comes *now* in mercy (in, with, and under the means of bread and wine). Be ready to come into the presence of the very God who created and redeemed you so that you may receive the forgiveness, life, and salvation that He has promised to all who believe in Him.
- Repent. Drown your Old Adam with contrition and repentance, and be clothed in the righteousness of Christ Jesus that when He comes *again* to judge the living and the dead on Judgment Day you may be found ready (your faith aglow with the sacred oil of the Holy Spirit, who delivers the Light of the World).

Dear brothers and sisters, Advent is indeed preparing us for the Lord's comings. If you have drifted away from the congregation of the Lord's people, now is the perfect time to return and to prepare your heart. Come and hear the word of the Lord. Hear the Law's stinging call to repentance for all the times you have gone your own way and ignored the way of the Lord. More than that, receive the balm of the Gospel message: Jesus comes to forgive and to save you. He comes to strengthen and preserve your body and life. He comes to cheer your spirit and to make you whole.

Sometimes, when we look at everything that needs to be done in order to prepare for a special occasion, we just give up because the obstacles just appear to be so insurmountable. Let that not be the case for us, the children of God. Let us be steadfast in our repentance, daily drowning our unbelief in the water of our Baptism, that on the day of His coming we may greet Him with joy and gladness. It's Advent. We have preparations that need to be done, and all preparations begin with one step forward.

Christmas is suppose to be peaceful and happy, right? Yet our families experience arguing and brokenness even during this supposedly joyous time of year.

Be at peace: our Savior was born to a people and world that should have loved Him, but instead reviled and rejected Him. He endured such hatred for you.

"We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves" (1 Thess. 5:12-13).

Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Do you have a person or two on your list that you just don't know what to give them? While I know you are running short of ideas...dad doesn't really want another tie, and your kid's teacher doesn't need another coffee mug. It can be nothing short of maddening to try to figure things out in the middle of this busy season!

As stewards of all of life and life's resources, we know that life is more than giving gifts. We stewards never want to take anything the Lord provides for granted. During this season of Advent and Christmas, it is a great idea to do whatever you can to be a faithful steward of your pastor. Even more so than the rest of the year, the demands on their time, their presence and their stewardship of the Gospel in the congregation become heightened.

The demands on pastors can wear them down and wear them out. How does the steward in the congregation serve as a faithful steward of the treasure that is their pastor? Here are a few ideas:

- · Put them at the top of your prayer list. Pray that the Lord guards them against the weariness that makes them susceptible to the work of the devil.
- · Make worship a priority St. Paul admonishes the Thessalonians and us to respect those who labor among us. There is no greater way to steward your pastor than to respect him enough to show up and receive what he has been sent to offer in the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Holy Sacraments.
- \cdot Be receptive to his work If your pastor is tasked with calling you to repentance or encouraging you to be in worship, know that he is only caring for your soul.
- · Esteem him highly Take the time to thank him for his faithful service to Christ, the congregation and your family.
- · Be at peace This is an easy time for even minor annoyances to get blown out of proportion and become full-blown conflict. This not only spoils the season of Advent and Christmas, but it also spoils our stewardship of the Gospel and those who serve us in that Gospel. Remember that Jesus came into the world to be the Prince of Peace. This is an act of grace and mercy. The steward seeks to reflect this toward their pastor and their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Stewardship at Christmas can be a challenge. Stewardship of your pastor during this time of the year is critical to our shared stewardship of the Gospel at a time of year when many are more open to hear and receive it.
